

A special 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Exhibition was hosted at three public libraries, attracting thousands of visitors.

## Participation in CEDAW

Giving the opening statement for NGOs at the 88<sup>th</sup> United Nations Committee on the Elimination of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW) Public Informal Meeting in Geneva. SCWO and our member organisations, AWARE, NTUC Women and Family, PPIS, SG Her Empowerment and United Women Singapore, were among the twelve NGOs from Singapore that were present at the 88<sup>th</sup> CEDAW session. Immediate Past President, Junie Foo gave a three-minute oral statement which included points from NTUC Women and Family, United Women Singapore and our partners, Centre for Fathering and Safe Place.





## IN HER STRIDE: THREADS OF RESILIENCE



### 14 Designs. 14 Stories of Resilience.

Fashion Design students from Nanyang Academy of Fine Arts, University of the Arts Singapore (NAFA UAS) took inspiration from real stories of survivors of abuse, transforming pain into purpose, and threads into testimony. Each piece is a tribute to resilience, courage, and the power of being heard.

SCWO's *In Her Stride: Threads of Resilience* campaign celebrated the strength of violence survivors through a unique collaboration with NAFA UAS fashion design and fashion management students and New2U by SCWO.

Using pre-loved fabrics donated by the community, students transformed these materials into one-of-a-kind fashion pieces symbolising resilience, hope, and renewal. Each piece was paired with a survivor's story, amplifying their voices and showcasing their journeys of recovery and empowerment.

This meaningful campaign **raised \$32,000**, driving awareness and support for survivors of violence. *In Her Stride* exemplifies the transformative power of creativity, storytelling, and community in honouring resilience and building hope for a brighter future.



# SUMMIT FOR ACTION ON GENDER EQUALITY (SAGE)

The inaugural **SCWO SAGE: Summit for Action on Gender Equality**, held on 5th September 2024, was a landmark event bringing together local and international thought leaders, women leaders, male allies, SCWO member organisations, and women's groups.

This impactful summit served as a vital platform for addressing critical issues impacting women's development and gender equality, both in Singapore and globally.



Featuring three keynote speeches and four dynamic panel discussions, the summit delved into pressing topics such as The Role of Women Amid a Population Decline, Closing the Gender Pay Gap with Transparency, Recognising Care Work as a Valuable Economic Activity, and How Societal Structures Can Change for an Ageing Population.

These discussions explored the challenges women face in reconciling personal, career, and family aspirations, particularly in the context of Singapore's declining fertility rate.

# RESEARCH & INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS

SCWO drives research and advocacy on workplace inclusivity, caregiving, and ageing while contributing to national and global gender equality efforts.

## CONVENTION ON THE ELIMINATION OF ALL FORMS OF DISCRIMINATION AGAINST WOMEN (CEDAW)



In collaboration with the Ministry of Social and Family Development (MSF), SCWO led efforts to gather ground-up feedback on Singapore's Sixth Periodic Report to the UN Committee on the Elimination of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW), submitted in 2021. **Over 100 participants from SCWO member organisations and community partners** were engaged in a comprehensive feedback session to reflect on the nation's progress in upholding women's rights and addressing gender-based discrimination.

In May 2024, SCWO was among the twelve NGOs that attended Singapore's Constructive Dialogue with the CEDAW Committee in United Nations, Geneva.

Immediate Past President, Junie Foo delivered a three-minute oral statement that highlighted the often-overlooked issue of gender ageism. She also spoke on zero-tolerance for workplace harassment and advocated for paid family care leave and equalising parental leave.

Following the Constructive Dialogue in Geneva, SCWO convened a closed-door engagement session in September 2024 with more than **70 participants** to discuss follow-up actions aligned with the White Paper on Singapore Women's Development. This session focused on identifying policy and community-based strategies to build on the progress reported, ensuring that CEDAW principles continue to be meaningfully implemented in Singapore's social, legal, and institutional frameworks.

## DIALOGUES, DISCUSSIONS AND ENGAGEMENTS

SCWO deepened conversations around workplace inclusivity by hosting a dialogue with Minister for Manpower Dr Tan See Leng, and Minister of State for Education and Minister of State for Manpower, Miss Gan Siow Huang.

The session drew over 100 participants and covered important upcoming shifts such as the Tripartite Guidelines on Flexible Work Arrangement Requests and the Workplace Fairness Legislation.

These conversations allowed both employers and employees to better understand what's ahead and contributed valuable insights toward shaping a more equitable workforce.



## INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS



SCWO welcomed over **170 visitors** from across the globe, including high-level delegations from Saudi Arabia, China, Kenya, and representatives from the United Nations General Assembly. These visits were opportunities for knowledge exchange and deepened understanding of the unique role SCWO plays as Singapore's national coordinating body for women's organisations.

As a member of the ASEAN Confederation of Women Organisations (ACWO), SCWO attended the Biannual General Assembly and Presidency Handover to Vietnam, held in Manila, Philippines in November 2024.

# MEDIA COVERAGE

In 2024, SCWO strengthened its role as a key voice for women's rights with **125 media** features across **articles, podcasts, interviews, and commentaries**.

These platforms spotlighted issues from domestic violence to workplace fairness, amplifying the realities women face.

Our consistent media presence has driven national conversations, highlighted impactful programmes, and reaffirmed SCWO's commitment to advancing gender equality across all spheres.



# MAINTENANCE SUPPORT CENTRAL

**Maintenance Support Central (MSC)** has been empowering individuals facing financial abuse since its establishment in 2011, following amendments to the Women's Charter. MSC provides vital assistance to those who have experienced distress due to delayed maintenance payments or lack of support from their spouse or partner.

In 2024, MSC provided critical support to the community, assisting **246 clients** with maintenance filings, offering **159 legal consultations**, and delivering **emotional support to 188 individuals**. Client feedback reflects a growing sense of empowerment and confidence in making informed decisions for themselves and their families.

To strengthen public understanding of family law, MSC conducted **five talks** attended by **122 participants**, including professionals and members of the public. These sessions received positive responses for their practical relevance and clarity.

A new initiative was the launch of **the Single Mothers Support Group**, which has quickly become a safe and supportive space for single mothers to connect, share, and uplift one another.

# STAR SHELTER

**Star Shelter** is a safe haven for women and children fleeing family abuse, providing a secure environment where they can heal, rebuild their lives, and regain independence. Established as a critical resource for those in crisis, Star Shelter offers holistic support, including counselling, case management, and advocacy services to empower individuals to overcome their circumstances.

In 2024, the shelter assisted **50 women and 28 children**, providing **266 hours of tailored counselling and case management services**. Thanks to the dedication of over **120 volunteers and sponsors**, residents participated in a wide range of recreational, educational, and therapeutic activities that enhanced their well-being. The positive feedback from residents and volunteers alike reflects the meaningful, mutual impact of these programs.

## Raising Awareness on Domestic Violence

Beyond direct support, Star Shelter remains steadfast in its advocacy efforts to raise awareness about domestic violence, challenging societal norms and inspiring lasting change.

Through school talks, awareness booths at corporate and community events, and accessible resources, both digital and print, Star Shelter fosters meaningful dialogue and collective action towards a violence-free society.

# SHECARES@SCWO

SHECARES@SCWO, an initiative in collaboration with SG Her Empowerment (SHE), is Singapore's first one-stop support centre dedicated to helping victims and survivors of online harms. Since its launch on January 19, 2023, the centre has been providing essential services such as a helpline, counselling, legal assistance through Pro Bono SG volunteers, and support with police reports.

Only in its second year of operations, SHECARES@SCWO has assisted **161 clients**, delivered **232 counselling sessions**, and hosted **45 legal clinics**. A unique feature of the centre is its support with in-app reporting, where the team works with leading platforms like LinkedIn, Snapchat, Google/YouTube, Meta, TikTok, and X to expedite reports through trusted flagger programmes, ensuring harmful content is swiftly addressed.

The centre has partnered with corporations, institutions, and social service agencies to conduct training and presentations, reaching a diverse range of audiences. # BOARDAGENDER

BoardAgender focuses on increasing the awareness of gender-balanced boards and businesses in Singapore. The Mentoring programme aims to cultivate a robust pipeline of accomplished women prepared for board positions and connect them with seasoned mentors who are experienced board directors.



**BoardAgender** is committed to increasing the representation of women in boardrooms across Singapore. In 2024, the initiative hosted 12 sessions, engaging **161 aspiring women directors** through collaborations and events designed to raise awareness about the value of diverse and inclusive boards.

This year, BoardAgender has also expanded the **BoardAgender Mentoring Programme for Aspiring Women Directors**, increasing the number of mentees from 10 to 12. The programme has enriched its offerings with new sessions, including **Understanding Legal Responsibilities** and **Fraud Considerations**, alongside existing sessions on topics like **Serving on Non-Profit Boards (CNPL)**, **Russell Reynolds**, and **Personal Branding**.

# SINGAPORE WOMEN'S HALL OF FAME

The Singapore Women's Hall of Fame (SWHF) was established to honour and preserve the legacies of exceptional women, celebrating their strength, resilience, and contributions across various fields and generations. As SWHF marked its 10th anniversary, SCWO continued its mission to recognise and celebrate the remarkable achievements of Singapore's women through a range of impactful programmes.



The Singapore Women's Hall of Fame (SWHF) reached out to an **estimated 40,000 individuals** through its various public engagements.

The **10th Anniversary Exhibition**, hosted across three public libraries, drew thousands and brought feminist history into the heart of the community. Heritage walks and fireside chats further deepened public engagement, offering fresh perspectives and sparking dialogue across generations.

# PROJECT AWESOME

An outreach programme of the Singapore Women's Hall of Fame, Project Awesome continued to expand its reach into primary and secondary schools in its effort to inspire young generations of boys and girls.



Over the year, Project Awesome organised **21 craft workshops, nine exhibitions, nine storytelling sessions, and three guided tours**, bringing herstories to life through hands-on, interactive formats. These sessions not only introduced young participants to the contributions of women in fields such as education, science, and the arts, but also encouraged personal reflection on leadership and resilience.

The AWESOME Art Competition 2024 received an overwhelming **407 entries** across four age categories (ages 7–16). Participants submitted A3 artworks in both traditional and digital formats, drawing inspiration from the SWHF categories of Law, Community/Social Work, and Environment/Conservation.

A total of **24 winners** were selected, with 1st, 2nd, 3rd place and Honourable Mentions awarded in each age group. The competition encouraged young artists not just to create, but to reflect on what leadership and contribution mean in today's world, reinforcing the values celebrated through the Hall of Fame.







## **Disclosure of Remuneration**

During the financial year, 3 of the three highest paid staff received more than \$100,000 but less than \$200,000 each in annual remuneration.

No paid staff serve on the Board of SCWO.

SCWO has no paid staff, who are close members of the family of the Board members, Chief Executive Officer or Deputy Chief Executive Officer, who each receives total remuneration exceeding \$50,000 during the financial year.

## **Principal Sources of Funding**

SCWO is mainly funded by government grants and donations. Other income includes membership fees, rooms rental, thriftshop sales and fees for its various programmes and services.

## **Funds**

SCWO has several funds which are ringfenced by agreements with funding agencies or donor's intent. These ringfenced funds are disclosed in note 21, 22 and 24 of the audited accounts.

The Singapore Women's Hall of Fame ("SWHF") was launched on 14 March 2014 to recognise and honour the outstanding women of Singapore in all fields of endeavour. Through an annual induction ceremony where outstanding women are honoured, the SWHF also shares, through rigorous outreach efforts, these inspiring stories with students and the public to inspire and educate.

SWHF fund is ringfenced by donor's intent. As at the financial year end, SWHF fund has a small deficit of \$5.3k as the actual income was lower than expected. Management plans to address the deficit by increasing income including donations and programme fees.

### **Purpose of Assets held**

SCWO's assets comprised leasehold property, furniture and fittings, office equipment, renovations and computers which are used for its operations.

### **Reserves**

SCWO aims to maintain its reserves at a level equivalent to at least 2 times the current annual operating expenditure. SCWO regularly monitors its cashflows and manages its funds to ensure they are adequate to fulfil continuing obligations. SCWO's reserves policy is disclosed in note 32 of its audited accounts.


